
We mark another year of continuous effort to assist our less privileged children toward better health and education. This gained the recognition and support of both public and private sectors and the appreciation of communities where we operate.

Many have asked how we were able to do all these and I still have the same answer:



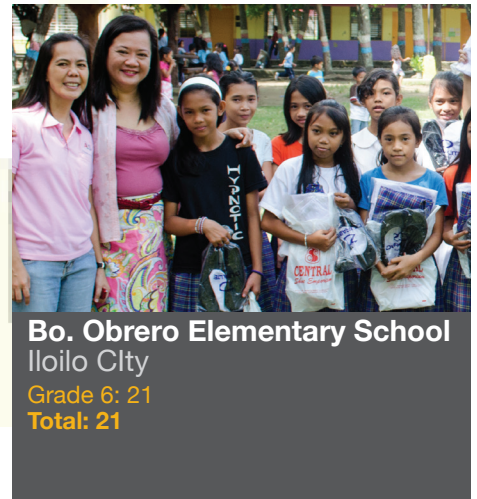

Financial Assistance

For school year 2014-2015, Uygongco Foundation Inc. provided financial assistance to 649 Elementary and High School students. Beneficiaries came from the 14 UFI adopted schools in Iloilo City, Guimaras and Capiz. The assistance given to the beneficiaries includes school supplies, uniforms, bags, umbrellas, school shoes with socks, caps, grocery packs and rice subsidies.

In order to retain their assistance, students must perform to an academic standard with 75% average for Elementary School students and 80% for High School students.

UFI continued to add more beneficiaries in 2014 with 81 new students joining the program.

Tertiary Scholarship



In 2014, Uygongco Foundation Inc. celebrated the graduation of two tertiary scholars, Remington Salaya and Gevelyn Lasquite. Remington graduated Cum Laude of BS Chemical Engineering, while Gevelyn graduated BS Business Administration major in Financial Management. Both scholars were students of Central Philippine University.

As for school year 2014-2015, UFI was proud to be supporting the tertiary education of 23 scholars at 8 separate institutions in Iloilo City. Tertiary scholars were provided full coverage of tuition fees as well as a small stipend dependent on the size of their respective tuition fees.

At the end of their studies, scholars are then guaranteed at least 2 years of employment in one of the La Filipina Uy Gongco Group of Companies.

All tertiary scholars participate in UFI formation sessions throughout the year as well as volunteering to assist UFI staff during giving activities, summer activities and general administration work.

Feeding Program

All 411 elementary school students are beneficiaries of UFI's feeding program. Each day of the school year plus one month during summer vacation, the students are given a nutritious, well balanced meal by the parents. The parents take turns to prepare and cook the food for their children, with the budget for all ingredients provided by the foundation. The budget allotted per student, per day is Php18, which compares favorably against other feeding programs.

Eat, Learn & Play

In order to continue feeding the students during the summer break, UFI combines games and classroom learning over a four week period in April/May. Uygongco Foundation Inc. recognizes play as an important part of children's development, with Eat, Learn & Play, the program hopes to achieve a balance between health and academic learning.





Linis Bata

In May, before the start of classes for the new school year, UFI conducted Linis Bata which is part medical mission, part grooming. Head lice removal, deworming, ear cleaning, nail clipping and hair cutting are all part of the activity performed over one day.

Skills Training

UFI's Skills Training program aims to up-skill and empower the teachers and parents, especially the women of the adopted schools. In 2014, two trainings were conducted:

Baking

Each year Philippine Foremost Milling Corporation provides commercial baking skills training for our adopted schools. In April 2014, A. Bonifacio Elementary School and Fort San Pedro National High School parents and teachers were the lucky recipients of the 10-day training program. The schools were then given baking supplies and equipment to begin their own baking production.

Entrepreneurial

To complement the Commercial Baking Skills Training, UFI provided adopted schools with entrepreneurial training in October. It is this training that can assist the schools in selling and marketing their baked goods and other products such as vegetables and fruits from the school gardens.



Teacher Training

In late October teachers from our adopted elementary schools come together to take part in a 2-day storytelling workshop by Museo Pambata.

Formation Sessions

UFI high school and tertiary beneficiaries took part in formation sessions during 2014 focusing on themes such as getting to know one's self, team building, communication and values. The formation sessions aim to inspire and empower the students to become better leaders, not only within their respective schools but also at home and within their communities.

For the tertiary scholars, the sessions will hopefully inspire them to become future leaders within the La Filipina Uy Gongco Group of Companies.

ALS

During August, UFI provides our adopted Iloilo City high schools with instructional materials and supplies for the Alternative Learning System (ALS) program. Materials include a projector and screen, supplies, t-shirts and ALS modules.

Iron Deficiency Testing

In partnership with Pediatrica, iron deficiency testing was conducted in two adopted schools in September: A. Bonifacio Elementary School and Rizal Elementary School. 363 students underwent testing, of which, 154 or 42% were found to be iron deficient. The students found to be iron deficient were given the required dosage of iron supplements by UFI as an intervention.



Book Giving

UFI joined Center for Art, New Ventures and Sustainable Development (CANVAS) in their quest to give '1 Million Books for 1 Million Filipino Children'. 1,100 books were given to students of our adopted elementary schools in Capiz: Aranguel Elementary School and Pres. Roxas East Elementary School.



Typhoon Yolanda Rebuilding

Following Typhoon Yolanda's destruction in November 2013, three of Uygongco Foundation's schools in Capiz were left with a huge clean-up job. Aranguel Elementary School, Pres. Roxas East Elementary School & Cabugcabug National High School all suffered extensive damage to classrooms, roofs and other structures such as stages.



Fortunately for the adopted schools, UFI received extraordinary help from external donors for the rebuilding of classrooms and other structures. Much of the help that was extended were from suppliers of La Filipina Uy Gongco Group of Companies as well as other international and local private and corporate donors. UFI thanks them all! 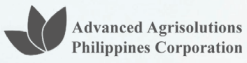
