



Education for social progress continues to be a central theme for UFI's activities in 2015. We continue to make basic education a priority with the hope that our programs will eventually improve the quality of life for the entire community.

We have continued and even expanded our signature programs that now have over one thousand beneficiaries for the past 6 years: the financial assistance program which aims to get children to school and the




### feeding Program

### All adopted elementary schools

Proper nourishment stimulates an individual's ability to learn hence the importance of meals for students. Catering UFI elementary beneficiaries on a daily school-day basis, the Feeding Program provides them with one balanced meal within the allotted PHP 18 per day budget. The meals are prepared by parents who take turns in preparing and cooking which all the more encourages their active participation towards motivating the kids to stay in school.

**Period:** Every school day from July to March and weekdays during the 5 weeks of summer

### All adopted elementary schools

UFI recognizes the need to develop school children holistically, even considering the value of proper hygiene and health practices which impact the psychosocial well-being of students in school. Hence, the foundation devised the Linis Bata Program which primarily includes Alis Bulate (deworming), Linis Kuko (nail clipping) and Alis Kuto (head lice removal), Linis Tenga (ear cleaning), and dental checkup & extraction.

### Skills Training

Fundamentally aimed at empowering the mothers of UFI beneficiaries as well as the teachers, the Skills Training Program is classified into Baking and Entrepreneurial Skills Trainings.

### Baking

April 13 - 24, 2015 Pres. Roxas East Elementary School

Pres. Roxas, Capiz







Done yearly in partnership with Philippine Foremost Milling Corporation (PFMC), this trains selected parents and teachers in commercial baking and the application of knowledge and skills for livelihood and income generation. For this year, the baking equipment and ingredients that were used during the training were turned over to two of the participating schools: Pres. Roxas East Elementary School and Cabugcabug National High School.

### Entrepreneurial

October 26 & 27, 2015 Villa Sagrado, Iloilo City

Hinging on enterprise as a source of livelihood, the Entrepreneurial Skill Training helps women, especially housewives, learn the basic and crucial skills of starting and managing a small enterprise.

### Alternative Learning System (ALS)

Extending the accessibility of education not merely to regular students but also to non-formal learners, UFI provides assistance to the alternative learning system by giving supplementary items to aid in their education.

**Beneficiaries:** 2 high schools (JMNHS & FSPNHS) & 1 elementary school (HES) **Items provided:** 4 wall fans, 2 steel cabinets, teaching aid (bond paper, pens, chalk, etc.), 40 arm chairs, and reproduced ALS modules (HES)

### Teacher Training

**November - December 2015** 

Valuing the role of teachers in the education of students, UFI assists teachers by providing them with their specified needs. This year, a Basic Computer Literacy Training for Teachers was conducted in two UFI adopted schools which introduced them to the parts of the computer, Microsoft Word, email, Microsoft Powerpoint presentation making and grading system using Microsoft Excel.

### In February, UFI was recognized as best NGO in Region 6 by the DSWD.


